

Internship, ECO-Syria Project

CMES is offering 1 part-time internship within the MECW project "ECO-Syria: Exploring Conflict-Environment Interactions for Sustainable Development and Conservation".

The Centre for Advanced Middle Eastern Studies (CMES) coordinates the Strategic Research Area (SRA) "The Middle East in the Contemporary World" (MECW). The research program consists of four research themes: 1) Environment and sustainable development; 2) Security and sustainable peace; 3) Democratization, migration and sustainable socio-economic development; and 4) Religion, identity and culture.

Project Description

More than a decade has passed since the war in Syria began in 2011, and since then the region continues to be a zone of armed conflict with devastating humanitarian and environmental consequences. In the midst of this turmoil, a new venture has emerged in the form of the Autonomous Administration of Northern and Eastern Syria (NES), commonly known as Rojava. In 2012, Rojava cantons started forming as self-proclaimed independent, self-governing units. Later, in 2014, these cantons claimed de-facto independence by adopting a social contract, effectively establishing the region as a self-governing entity.

The project aims to understand the ongoing socio-economic, political, and ecological transformations in Rojava. The research team will employ interdisciplinary methods to generate scientific knowledge and policy recommendations for environmental and ecological sustainability and democracy in Rojava.

Qualifications

- Be a registered student at Lund University for the duration of the internship
- Ability to work both independently and in a research team
- Skills in English required
- Good written and verbal communication skills

Intern Responsibilities

The exact tasks to be carried out by the intern will be discussed with the research team but may include:

- Assisting the research team in collecting written data on subject area
- Compiling a literature review
- Assisting the research team in organizing events related to the project

The internship is unpaid, part-time and temporary.
